

WARNING: When to see a doctor If you have any of the problems listed below, please see a doctor, preferably an ear-nose-throat doctor (an ENT). Your ear has a birth defect or an unusual shape. Your ear was injured or deformed in an accident. You saw blood, pus, or fluid coming out of your ear in the past 6 months. Your ear feels painful or uncomfortable You have a lot of ear wax, or you think something could be in your ear.	You get really dizzy or have a feeling of spinning or swaying (called vertigo) Your hearing changed suddenly in the past 6 months Your hearing changes: it gets worse then gets better again You have worse hearing in one ear You have ringing or buzzing in only one ear	purchase-option program.
